We achieved it! For all of us it is wonderful news, but in addition it will have a positive influence on the local community. You made all of this possible.

After passing such important milestones, it is always good to look back at where we started in the year 2012, in a rented three-room flat in Kampala. Therefore today with big gratitude we say again, thank you for your financial and practical support, for your prayers and support of any kind. We believe that the best is yet to come!

Further on, we will focus on the mission of GFaH Foundation and that is to help children in need. In the year 2015 our elementary school will open its doors, in the children's residence area we plan to build additional houses as well as broaden healthcare support not only for our children, but also for the community. Moreover, our team will grow, starting from year 2015 we will have 2 volunteers from Slovakia working and living in Uganda.

Thanks to year 2014 we have many reasons to celebrate, but we are looking forward to year 2015 even more.

UGANDA

In the year 2011 the Good Future and Hope foundation took over a children's home founded by a married couple, Christopher and Cynthia, to provide children with a home, education and future. A lot of our children were left behind by their parents or they are orphans. Today, they live in family-like houses. On the average, 10 children live in one house with a mother/caregiver.

In Uganda, very many children live on the streets in desperate conditions. It is an everyday struggle for survival without food, healthcare, education, future and hope. We try to save, provide a home, education and upbringing to as many children in need as possible.

Thanks to the program of virtual adoptions all our children attend a good elementary school, where they have access to good quality education. Our goal is to take in more children by building additional houses and an elementary school.

MYANMAR

The Children's Center in Myanmar was founded by married couple Grace and Run in the year 2011 with the goal to take care of orphans, children that were left behind and in need. Orphans, children left behind and in need, ranging in age from 7 to 16 years come from distant areas of states Chin and Kachin. These areas are among the poorest ones in Myanmar. Many children in these areas do not have access to education, because there are no available schools nearby.

Our goal is to ensure high quality education to as broad a circle of children in Myanmar as possible, and also to enable their acquiring various skills through specialized trainings, that will be a big plus for their future.

SUMMARY 2014 - UGANDA

CHILDREN'S HOME:

- We accepted 5 new children in the children's home, including 2 neighborhood children, whose parents died from HIV.
- We finished construction of the 4th house – at the moment we have 4 houses with infrastructure and the foundations of an additional 5 houses completed.
- We built solar panels in the houses and installed electricity in every house, this enables children to prepare for school in their after school hours.
- We completed a multifunctional house that serves as a reception, with room for the guard and also storage of building material.
- We built a small stable for cattle and goats and bought another plot of land that will be used for agricultural purposes.
- We improved the landscape around the houses and planted bushes and trees, including anti-snake plants.
- In the children's home we succeeded in drilling a borehole and getting fresh drinking water!

SCHOOL:

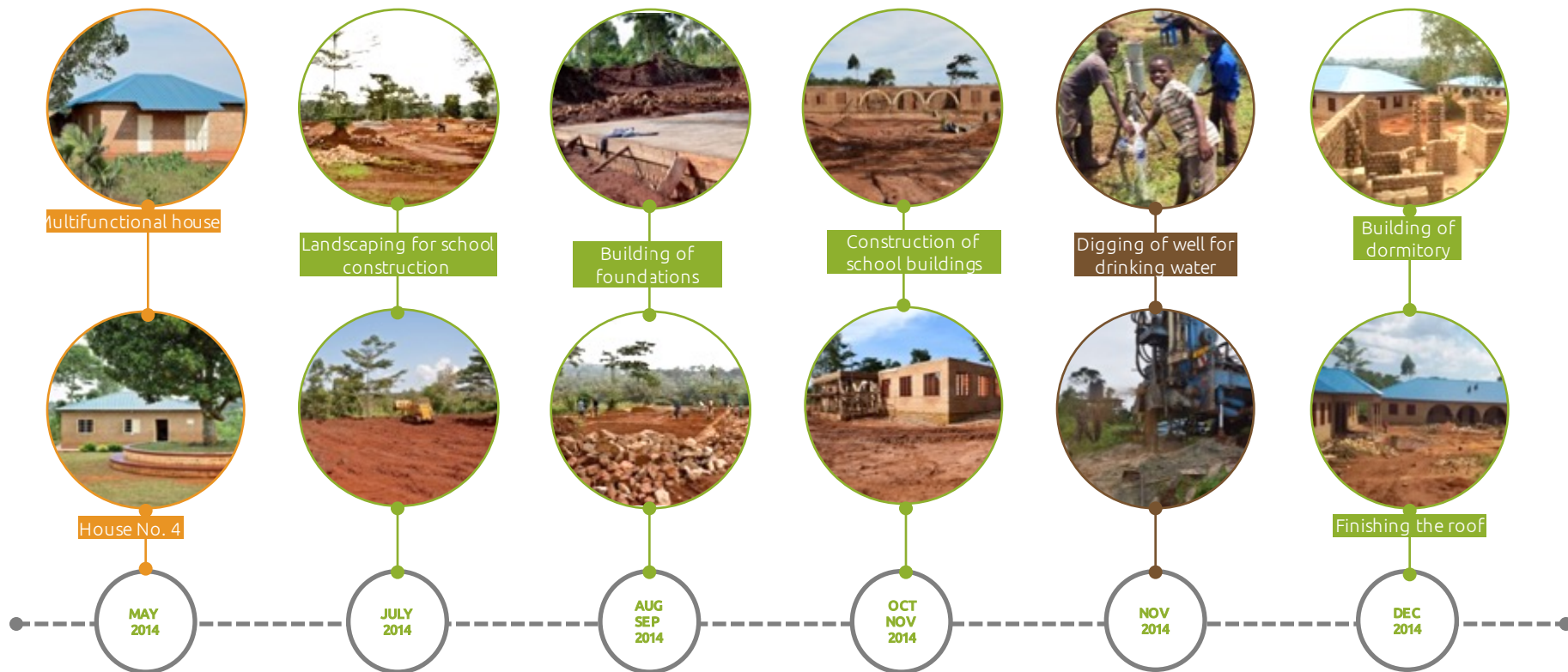
- We completed 3 buildings of the primary school with a capacity for 280 students, a school restroom with full infrastructure and the first dormitory building.

FURTHER ACHIEVEMENTS:

- We prepared our first "Come & See" trip for sponsors and volunteers.
- We organized the official opening ceremony of the local foundation of Good Future and Hope Ministries in Uganda. 800 people from local communities and villages and very esteemed guests took part in this festive occasion.
- We established a close corporate support engagement with SAP and with VOSS Foundation
- 2 new foster mothers

SUMMARY 2014 - MYANMAR

- Thanks to virtual adoption parents, we provided food, home, healthcare and education for 28 children (15 boys and 13 girls)
- We extended the rent agreement for the house for another year.
- Thanks to the foundation partners we were able to:
 - Buy additionally, clothes and light footwear for all children
 - Take the children for a one-day trip to the ZOO
 - Pay for health tests and intensive medical care for one of our children that had unexpected diagnosis of bleeding in the brain.
- We provided paid afternoon lessons for children in the 9 – 11th grades to improve the quality of their preparation for final exams.
- The oldest child graduated from the 11th grade, passing the state exam and thanks to sponsor gifts we were able to provide vocational training for him, where he learned how to repair mobile phones and electrical devices. It was so interesting and useful for him that he decided to open his own repair shop in his home town.
- We bought a very nice plot of land in Yangon city, so that we are ready for further expansion and building of a training center.
- We visited the regions of Kachin and Chin, that are most stricken by poverty. We also had an opportunity to talk to the leaders of their communities, so that we are able to support vulnerable children directly in their environment in the future.



PLANS FOR YEAR 2015

UGANDA

- **Completion of first house set of 9 houses will enable us to save approximately 35 more children** – entire construction of 5 houses from foundation up to roof requires budget of 5 x 25.000 EUR = 125.000 EUR /
- **Purchase of used all terrain vehicle (4WD) for local team (1* half of year 2015)/** budget required: 25.000 EUR /
- **Increased security by building fencing around houses and school/** budget required: 30.000 EUR /
- **Construction of good quality entrance road to the school and houses /** budget required: 20.000 EUR /
- **Expansion of construction of elementary school complex /** budget required: 80.000 EUR for teachers' houses, 100.000 EUR for additional dormitory house, 60.000 EUR for construction of classrooms of grades P5-P7, 60.000 EUR for fully equipped school canteen and dining room /
- **Installation of solar energy driven pumps for first borehole for water and drilling of second borehole for clean drinking water for elementary school complex and dormitory (2nd half of year 2015) /** budget required: 25.000 EUR /
- **Food improvement. We will start a goat and cattle farm and teach children how to take care of animals /** budget required : 7.000 EUR for cattle and goats/ **as well as grow basic plants and teach children basic agricultural skills and supply school with its own products /** budget required: 4.000 EUR /
- **Employing new educated people** (1 nurse, 1 driver, 2 agricultural workers, cca. 5 new elementary school teachers)
- **Wider offer of voluntary work not only in children's home, but also at the elementary school**

MYANMAR

- **Building of classrooms from bamboo that will serve for our own training center /** budget required: 50.000 EUR /
- **Give the children in our program the best chance for good passing of final exams in the 11th grade** with the help of paid additional afternoon classes
- In addition to our regular sponsor contributions program, introduce contributions that will ensure that children after the 11th grade have the opportunity to get the **vocational specific training that will enable them to work and finance themselves independently.**
- **Investigation of further avenues of how to provide children from endangered and distant regions Chin and Kachin access to education.**

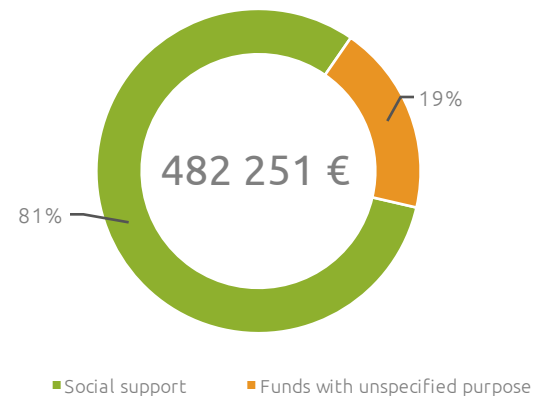

Funds raised according to: purpose of use

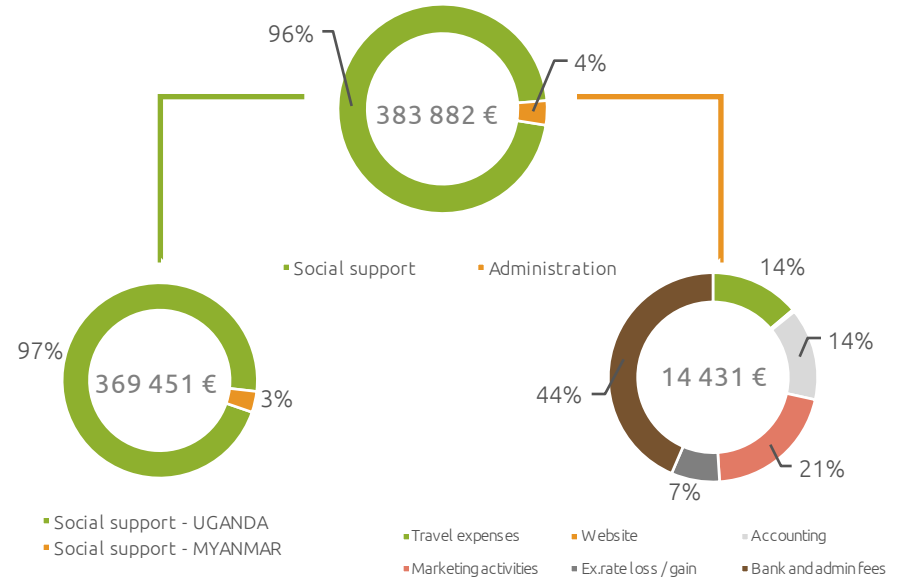


Funds raised according to: purpose of use

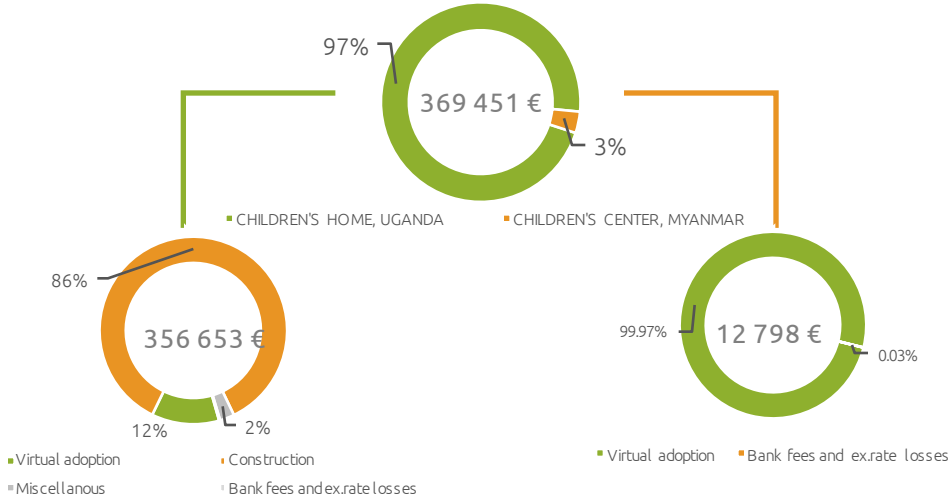
