2018 was a challenging year. But also a rewarding year at the same time. You might recall the security challenges in Uganda which thankfully are under control again.

We are very proud to officially share that GFaH Primary School has scored at the final exams of our students as one of the best of the entire district. This is an amazing result and the community is so proud of our students such a stunning success. It is a testimony to the good work of the team on the ground and their wholehearted dedication to doing their best so these kids can have a good future and hope.

We have built 3 additional houses and by that, we expanded the capacity of children's' home for an additional 30 children. As mentioned, 2018 was also a challenging year, although 8 new children were admitted last year, the legal care documents are still in the process, and unfortunately, GFaH has no effect on speeding up the process. In 2019, this will still be our priority, given that it affects the process of admitting new children, despite sufficient capacity.

We also started the construction of protective walls in some areas of the property to avoid trespassing of people who shouldn't be allowed to the compound.

Also, our team in Myanmar continued to do great work. We visited Myanmar several times in 2018. The main objective was to reconsider the possibilities of realizing the vision we have in Myanmar for education. Many things happen slowly, which requires more patience. However, thanks to our children, we are proud and remain motivated. A great experience in 2018 was a visit to the museum where we could see traditional houses and replicas of many cultural monuments representing all the regions of Myanmar.

We continue to work for our ultimate goal which is to remove a child from any kind of child center and unite them with their extended family even in the case when the child center carries out their activities with all their heart and care as Run and Grace do.

2019 is a year we will again do everything as best as we can and together with your support we will work with even bigger enthusiasm.

Our projects solve specific problems and fulfill needs such as daily food, nutrition, healthcare and education. The support is connected to and focused on specific children included in our programs. We proceed step by step. We focus on areas where we are sure that we will see positive benefits for the children. We do not lose sight of our goals; everything we do must contribute to the fulfillment of our vision. We set goals and implement the appropriate measures on site in order to be able to review and measure the progress.

## SUPPORT OF LOCAL DEVELOPMENT

Through our activities, we support the development of the local economy. Therefore, we buy all the material, food and necessities in the local markets or from the local manufacturer if possible. We employ local people to work in the children homes, school and on the construction site. We aim to support the local communities, start self-sustaining projects and help children to become independent. In this way, we want to avoid the long-term dependence on the sponsors from abroad.

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## CHILDREN'S HOME

- GFaH currently supports 65 children - in various programs. 34 of them are currently living in children's home (incl. children of foster mothers), 37 of which are supported through our educational program.
- As in previous years, during 2018, we worked closely with the Ugandan Government and police authorities to investigate each child's background in our care, looking for family roots, close or distant relatives.
- In 2018, we were obliged to extend the certificate that entitles our local non-profit organization to operate in Uganda. This time the certificate was extended for the longest possible period of 5 years.
- 3 of our children have successfully completed primary school and have been admitted to high school
- 2 children have successfully completed high school and will continue their vocational training.
- We have successfully audited not only our financial accounts, but we have also undergone a general audit of the whole local organization, which was done by a certified audit company.
- We were able to buy a "new" used off-road vehicle - the Toyota Prado (1998). Compared to the previous vehicle, the running cost is almost 70% lower.
- 2018 was a fertile year for our small farm. We bought 2 new cows and during the year another addition was born. Thanks to this, we were able to supply our own milk not only to the children's home and school all year long, but also to many people from the surrounding community.
- To keep in mind the importance of productive collaboration and team spirit, in summer we organized a day-long team-building for all employees in Uganda, which not only taught us how to better understand and use the talents of people working together on the team, but we also had a day full of fun and great experiences.





# PRIMARY SCHOOL

- A total of 181 registered children, 66 pupils in nursery and 115 pupils in primary section. (Thereof 78 pupils in boarding section / 103 daily students)
- We have successfully completed the syllabus in all classes.
- 99% of pupils from all classes advanced to the next year
- In 2018, we went on a very successful study trip, for both nursery and primary children, organized by a travel agency with focus on various educational activities and explored new places.
- We currently provide transportation to daily students from over 22 neighboring villages
- We have successfully registered candidates in P7 who have passed the final PLE exams for the first time. The results of PLE surprised us very much and we are extremely proud of our graduates! All of them finished in divisions 1 and 2, which gave our school the best results in the district where we operate.
- We took part in the district sports day, where we ended up in a great second place in ball games.
- The external thematic curriculum workshops and internal item writing workshops has significantly improved the career development of our teachers.
- The establishment of a Disciplinary Committee has improved the discipline of children and all staff.
- In 2018 we faced a major child health challenge. Many children in school struggled with multiple diseases throughout the year. We also had to take action during the flu epidemic, when we closed our school gates for almost two weeks.



## CONSTRUCTION AND OTHERS

- In 2018, we completed the construction of additional 3 houses, thanks to which we completed the first circle of houses. We have increased the capacity of the children's home by the possibility of admitting another 30 children
- At the end of 2018, we also started with the second phase of building a brick wall around our premises - completion is scheduled for the first quarter of 2019.
- Because we build our own building bricks - in December 2018 we produced 15,000 bricks to be used build a school building. We are planning to build 4 school building in the first half of 2019, which will help us significantly improve the current capacity deficit. We were able to raise funds for the construction of the 4 school building thanks to the immense commitment of Good Future and Hope Deutschland eV, our branch in Germany, which we founded in 2017. Good Future and Hope Deutschland eV has requested several grants. In 2018 one of them was very successful as Cents for help e.V donated EUR 24,000 for the construction of the school building - THANK YOU! However, our German team did not just stopped there - in cooperation with "Physiologisch Vohrer und Eißler" they organized a fundraising project, thanks to which we was able to raise additional funds for the construction.
- 2018 was also a blessing for us in volunteering area. We had the honor of welcoming our loyal sponsor and volunteer who built a soccer goals for children and a kennel for our guard dog Samson. However, our loyal volunteer was not the only one involved - his company - B.E.Service, spol. s r.o., of which he is the executive, donated to us a generator and a new grass cutter! Once again - THANK YOU! The generator is very helpful for us in the rainy season.





## MYANMAR

- 3 of the children completed high school and started a practical course to provide them with useful experience and knowledge in finding a job.
- Our local partners Run and Grace have organized a day of games, full of fun and competitions for children from our children's center and surrounding villages.
- We visited Myanmar several times during the year - The main objective was to reconsider the possibilities of realizing the vision we have in Myanmar for education. Many things happen slowly, which requires more patience. However, thanks to our children, we are proud and remain motivated.
- A great experience in 2018 was a visit to the museum - the National Race Village, where we could see the traditional houses and replicas of many cultural monuments representing all the regions of Myanmar. It was a very emotional experience for children. Many of them come from different parts of Myanmar, and throughout the day they showed immense interest, pride in their local culture, but also a hint of grief behind their homeland.





# OUR PLANS FOR THE YEAR 2019

## UGANDA

- Purchase of new used 4x4 school minivan /required budget: 14.000 EUR/
- Extension of the primary school complex /required budget: 60.000 EUR for the construction of the class- rooms for grades P5- P7, 77.000 EUR for the fully equipped school kitchen and dining room/
- The second phase of building a brick wall around our premises /required budget: 65.000 EUR/
- Construction of football and volleyball field /required budget: 17.000 EUR/
- Rain water collection project /required budget: 25.000 EUR/
- Living and education expenses for supported children /required budget: 75.000 EUR/
- Operational cost for running junior school /required budget: 12.000 EUR/

## MYANMAR

- Give the children in our program the best possible chance of passing the final exams successfully in the 11th grade through the paid tutoring in the afternoon sessions
- Extension of the sponsorship program by adding contributions that will ensure that older children after the completion of 11th grade will get a vocational training with a specific focus, which will pave the way for them to become self-employed or financially independent.
- Living and education expenses for supported children /required budget: 12.000 EUR/

## ADMINISTRATION OF THE FOUNDATION

- Operations and administration of the foundation /15.000 EUR/
- Salaries and taxes for three employees /20.000 EUR/
- Travel expenses for three employees /7.000 EUR/

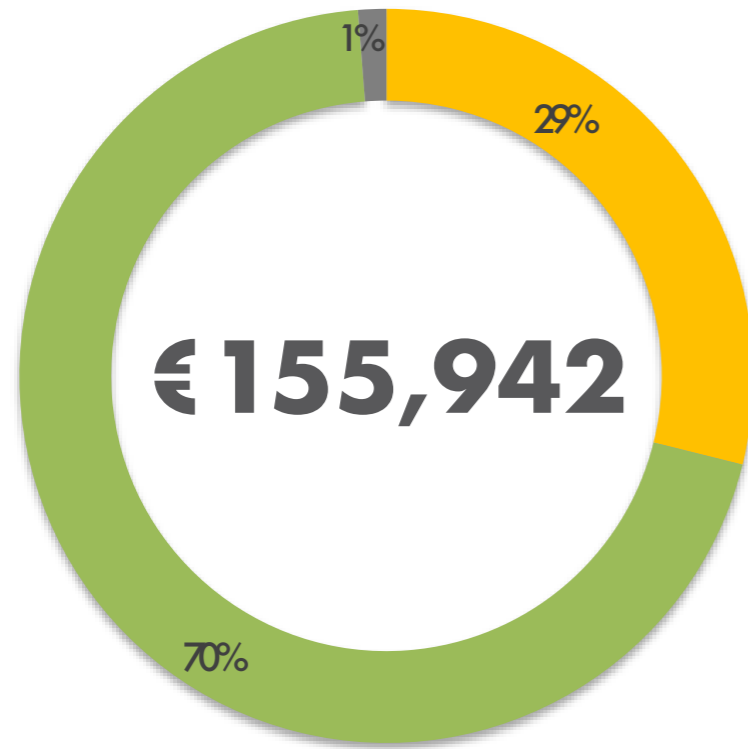

● Social support    ● Funds raised with unspecified purpose    ● Contribution from 2% of the income tax

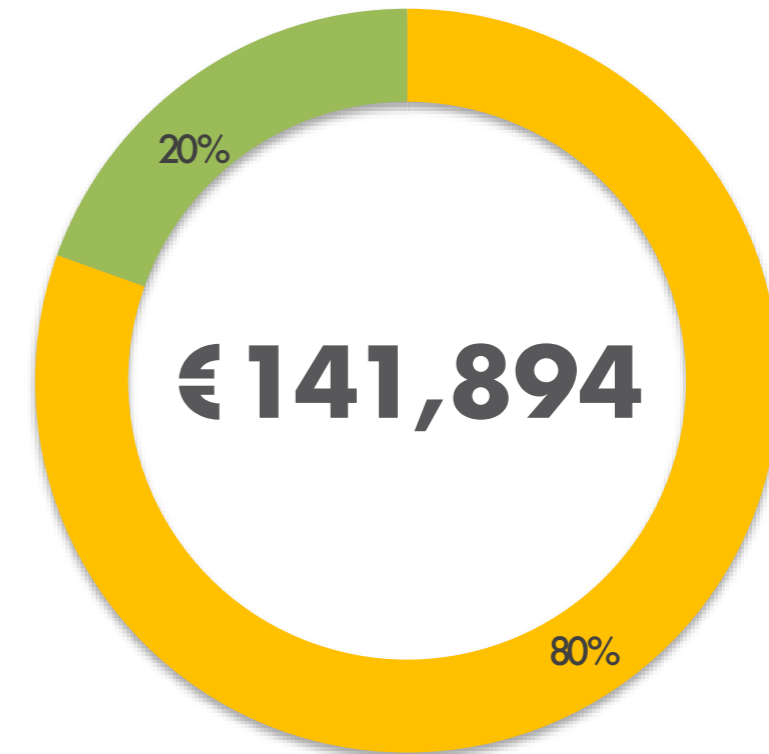

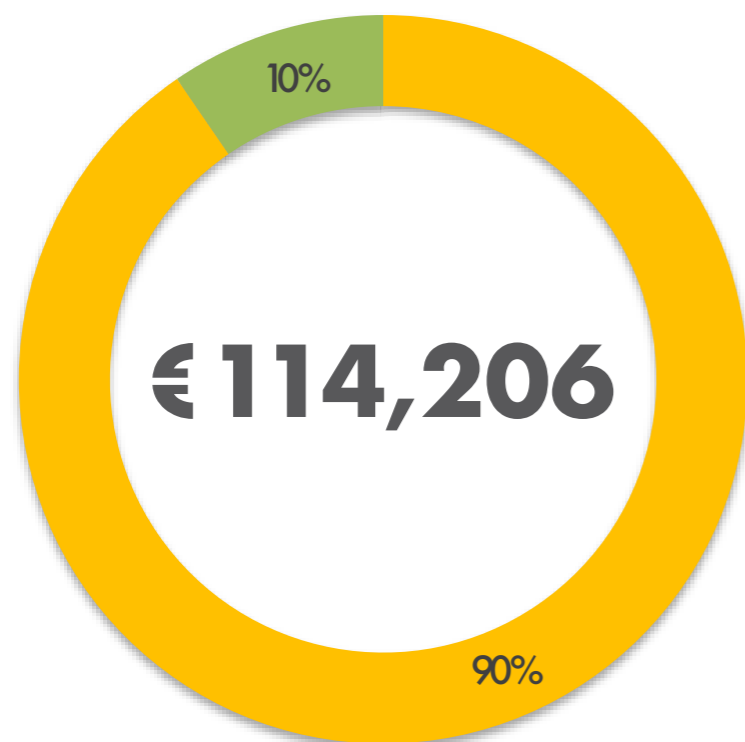
